Yellow Brick Road Activity



Materials

- Large yellow sheet of paper
- Coloured pens and pencils

How to play

- In small groups students are required to tell a story using the yellow brick road.
- By taking turns students will create an imaginative story.
- The first player will start with the orientation.
- Each player is required to verbally tell each part of the story and identify the different feature of the text type they are telling.

 Students are also required to draw items that relate to each part of the story on either side of the yellow brick road when it is their turn.
